DIRECTIONS TO UCT GRADUATE SCHOOL OF BUSINESS

Portswood Road, Green Point

Entering CT via N2

- Landmark: Cape Town International Convention
- Centre situated on the left hand side
- Pass the 1st set of Robots for the V&A Waterfront
- Next 2nd set of Robots turn right into Western Boulevard, Green point
- Keep to the right hand lane of the road into slipway (landmark BP Building)
- Turn right at robot into Portswood road
- Pass first road on right hand side
- Pass first entrance to Breakwater Lodge and GSB
- Next entrance is main reception to the GSB
- Security boom. Security will have a list of names for parking
